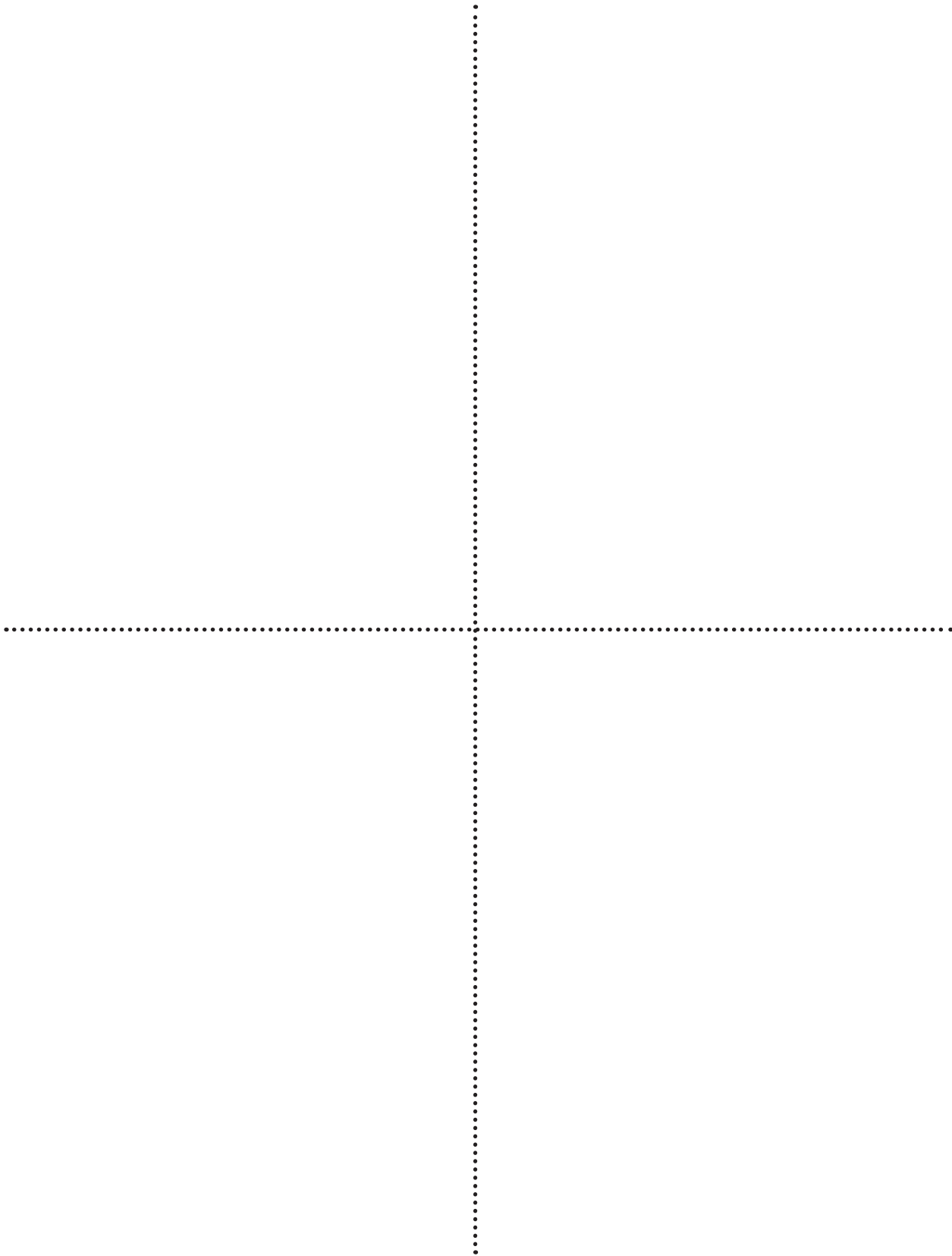


Lubaina's paintings include a lot of little details. Draw just a small part of a painting into one of the squares below. Look carefully. Did you see something you didn't notice before?

Use the other 3 squares to draw parts of Lubaina's other paintings.



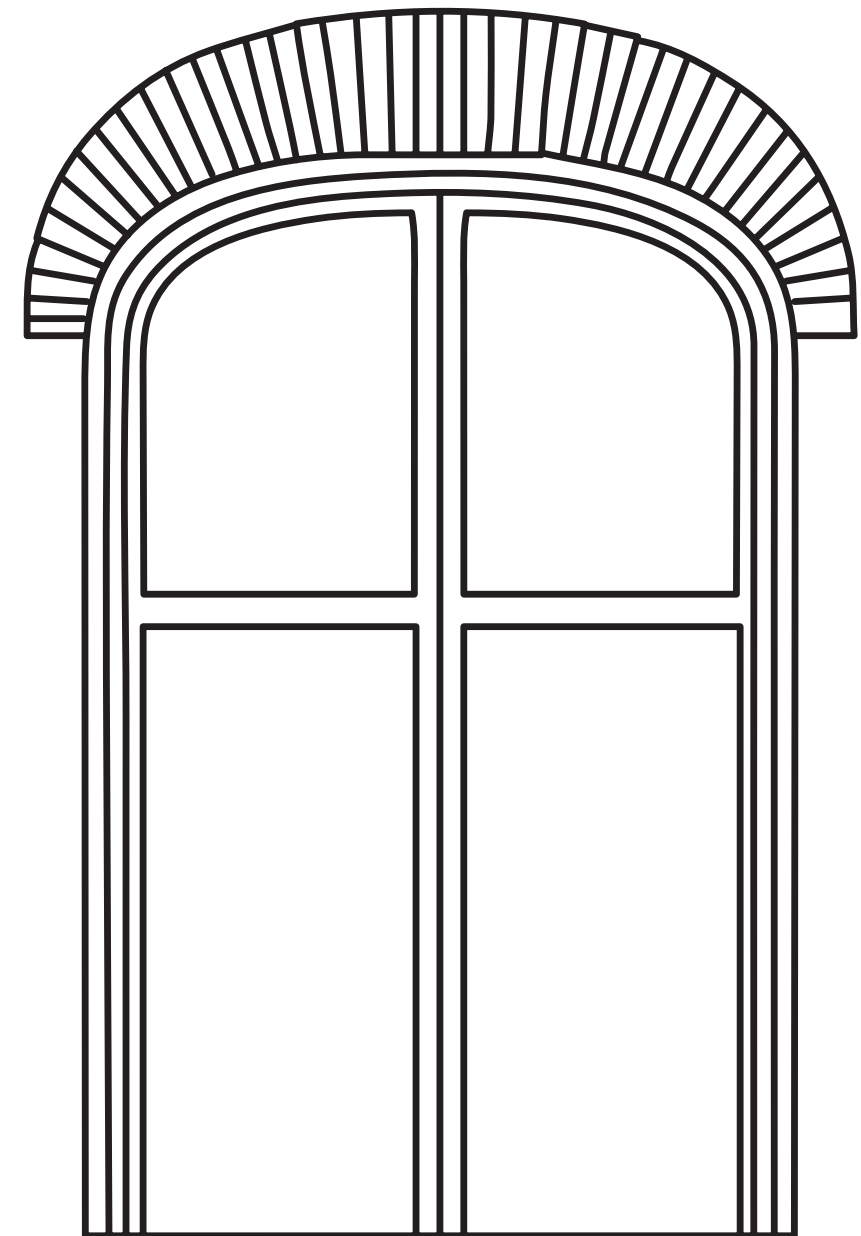
Lubaina Himid with Magda Stawarska: Another Chance Encounter



Doorway chats

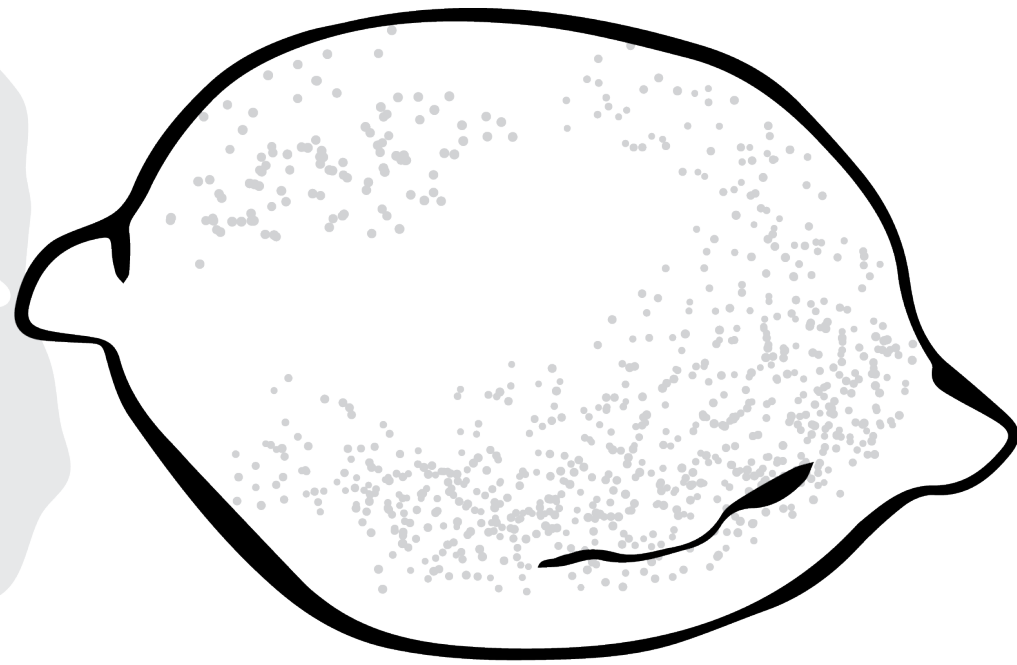
Artist Lubaina Himid is interested in how we share our feelings and who and where we share them with.

Draw two people talking together in this doorway. It is the door to the house at Kettle's Yard. What are they saying? What are they thinking? How do they feel today?



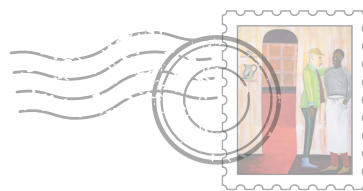
Slightly Bitter

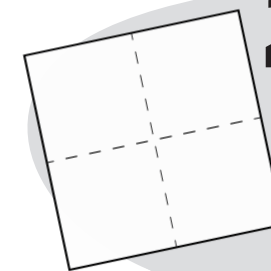
Another Chance Art Encounter

Have you ever wondered if you might be different if you had gone to a different school and made different friends? Perhaps you might like different games or have different hobbies?

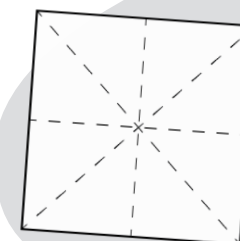
Lubaina and Magda are inspired by how 'chance' can make us who we are, what we do and what we think.

Follow the instructions below to make your own 'Art Chance Encounter' tool. It is based on a paper fortune teller.

1 Cut out the Art Chance Encounter tool on the back page.

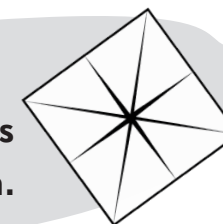


2 Have the tool facing down, fold the paper in half. Open it out again. Fold it the other way. Open it out again. You should have made a cross with the creases.

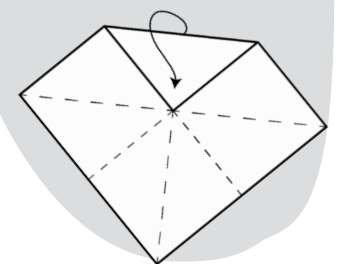


3 Fold a corner to the opposite corner. Open it out again. Fold the other corner to its opposite. Open it out again. You should now have a '+' and an 'x' shape.

5 Turn the new square over. Fold the new corners to the middle point again.



4 Take each corner point and fold it so it meets the middle of the sheet. You have a new, smaller square.



6 Flip the paper over. You should have 4 pockets, each with a picture on. You may need to pinch them open to be able to get the thumb and first finger of each hand, in each pocket.
